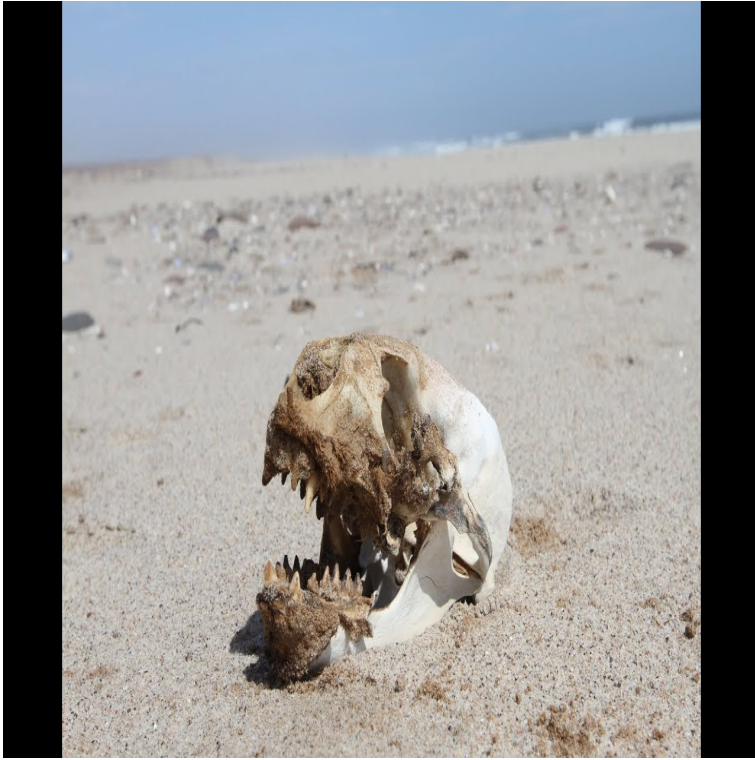


Skeleton Coast
